The World Federation for Mental Health (WFMH) is excited to invite individual or group artists to submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) for a commission celebrating World Mental Health Day (WMHD) 2024. Your piece should align with our webinar theme: *'Wellbeing at Work: Cultures of Support and Connection in the Pacific Region.'* The selected commission will receive \$AU500.

What We're Looking For:

- Theme: Your work should engage with mental health issues and reflect the webinar's theme.
- Medium: Digital story, video, artwork, music, song, dance, or other creative forms.
- Length: Up to 3 minutes. The artwork will be presented as a video-recording at our online webinar which will be held on Wednesday, October 2, 2024.
- Originality: Submit only new, original work created for this commission.

Submission Details:

- Precise: Briefly describe your piece (150-200 words), including its concept, connection to the theme, and impact.
- Previous Work: Include examples showcasing your relevant experience, such as video links, audio files, or images.
- Licensing: Your work will be used by WFMH for WMHD and may be shared widely. Provide your terms for usage and licensing.
- Inclusivity: We encourage submissions from diverse artists, including Pacific Islander and First Nations peoples and those with lived experience of mental health challenges. Ensure your work is respectful and inclusive.
